# Civil War Remembrance Weekend

Before it's over in April 1865, more than 3 million will have fought, and more than 750,000 will have died — the equivalent of 7.5 million dead today.

This year marks the sesquicentennial of 1865, the surrender of Gen. Robert E. Lee, the end of the war and the assassination of Abraham Lincoln, all in April. The joy of the ensuing peace was quickly dampened by an assassin's bullet at Ford's Theatre in Washington, D.C., causing the nation to mourn.

During this Memorial Day weekend, we invite you to become a part of living history as you travel through a microcosm of the Civil War. Union and Confederate reenactors, civilians, musicians and historic presenters — all in period attire — are eager to immerse you in this important American era.
