


73RD ANNUAL OLD CAR FESTIVAL

CHRYSLER CENTENNIAL

Walter Chrysler introduced the first car bearing his name in 1924. With its efficient high-compression engine and advanced hydraulic brakes, the Chrysler Six opened a new era in motoring. By the end of the decade, Mr. Chrysler had purchased Dodge Brothers, introduced DeSoto and Plymouth, and firmly established his Chrysler company as the last of Detroit's Big Three. Old Car Festival celebrates the Chrysler centennial with a focus on all the company's brands, along with predecessors like Maxwell, Chalmers and Graham Brothers.

It's a fitting tribute to Chrysler – the man and the machines.
